- *Toiletries (such as small shampoos, toothpaste, toothbrushes, hand lotion, razors, etc.)

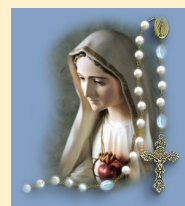
